## Frequently Asked Questions

Q: I received a voter registration card in the mail. Does this mean that my civil rights have been restored?

• Your rights have been restored only if there is a valid certificate of RCR on record. You

should abstain from voting unless you have a valid certificate of RCR. You can search for all RCR grants here: https://fpcweb.fpc.state.fl.us/

Q: I had "adjudication withheld" for a felony charge. Do I need to apply for RCR?

• No, an "adjudication withheld" is not a conviction, and does not cause the loss of civil

Rights.

- Q: I completed my sentencing in another state. Do I have to apply for RCR in Florida?
  - You need to apply for RCR in Florida if:
    - i. You were convicted of a felony in another state or a federal court while you were a Florida resident; or
  - ii. You were convicted of a felony in another state or a federal court and have not

had your rights restored before moving to Florida.

- If you were convicted of a felony in another state and had your civil rights restored before you became a Florida resident, you do not need to apply for RCR in Florida.
- NOTE: Some states restore rights automatically, without any paperwork, and a few never take the rights away at all. See, <a href="http://www.aclu.org/map-state-felony-disfranchisementlaws">http://www.aclu.org/map-state-felony-disfranchisementlaws</a>
- Q: How long does it take to have my application processed?
- The OEC is understaffed and many applications can take up to several years to be

processed.

- Q: Do I need an attorney to get this done?
  - No, you do not need an attorney for this process.
- Q: Will restoring my civil rights help me restore my right to own, use, or possess a firearm?
- No. Firearm authority is not restored even if your request for RCR has been granted.
- Q: How can I obtain certified copies of charging instruments and sentencing documents?
  - You must contact the Clerk of Courts in the county you were convicted. The clerk is supposed to provide you the documents **without charge**.

**Title XLVII** CRIMINAL PROCEDURE AND CORRECTIONS **Chapter 940** EXECUTIVE CLEMENCY

940.04 Copy of information or indictment to be furnished without

**charge**.—In the event any applicant for executive clemency is required to supply a certified copy of the applicant's information, indictment, judgment, or sentence, said document shall be furnished by the clerk of court to the applicant free of charge and without delay.
